



Theresa "Thessa" Obrero Churillo, RD, CSR

Thessa earned her Bachelor's degree in Nutrition and Dietitians at University of the East Manila, Philippines and proceeded to complete her internship in dietetics at the University of Virginia. This is her 26th year as a renal dietitian nutritionist at University of Virginia/Morrison Healthcare. Although born in Hawaii and a permanent resident of the United States, she spent her childhood and schooling years in the Philippines, regularly visiting her home and continuing to immerse herself in Filipino culture. Professionally, Thessa provides clinical nutrition care to chronic kidney disease and home dialysis patients with the interdisciplinary care team. Additionally, she is involved in patient educational projects including the CARES CKD 4 (Comprehensive Approach to Kidney Education and Support), TSU Dialysis Program (Transitional Start Unit) and Taking Care of Kidney Class for CKD patients. Thessa provides renal nutrition education to her multidisciplinary team, nutrition interns, and community groups. She is active in community kidney screenings that focus on the growing Filipino community in Charlottesville, VA.







Aaron Verzosa - Co-Owner/Chef, Archipelago Restaurant

Aaron Verzosa is a Filipino American chef born and raised in the Pacific Northwest. After graduating from the University of Washington and Seattle Culinary Academy, he worked at Seattle's Basque-focused restaurant, The Harvest Vine. Thereafter, he worked for Michelin starred chef David Toutain in Paris, as well as for Nathan Myrvohld as a part of Modernist Cuisine. Currently, Aaron run's Archipelago, a small restaurant in Hillman City serving a multi-course tasting menu that shines a light on the flavors of the Filipino diaspora and how over time, a minority can impact and shape the majority. The restaurant has received various awards and recognitions including Eater's Restaurant of the Year and The New York Times America's Favorite Restaurant List, Aaron is also a four time James Beard nominee for "Best Chef Northwest & Pacific" and "National Outstanding Chef". He was also named in Phaidon's 100 Emerging Chefs Around The World, and most recently won the Seattle Times People Choice Award for fine dining. Beyond the restaurant, Aaron is most focused on his community and family, working currently with fellow community leaders to bring Filipino history to all Seattle public schools.







Michelle Rowlette, MSW, LICSW

Michelle Rowlette, MSW, LICSW, has been in the healthcare field for nearly 25 years, and she has worked with patients in both inpatient and outpatient clinical settings. In 2020 Katy was awarded a Medal of Excellence from the American Association of Kidney Patients (AAKP).


Breana Killeen, MPH, RD
